The bubbles above will enable Mr O'Brien and Miss Hodge to continue with Home Learning for Year 5 and Year 6. From the 22nd June we will increase the on line contact time for these year groups and we will send more details of what this will look like next week.

If your child is in a class bubble (Nursery, Reception, Y1 or Y6), we are encouraging you to take up the full allocation of days (Mon-Thurs). There are no penalties for those who choose not to send their children back to school at this time. We do ask that children come to school on time. For children of Key Workers your child should only come to school when you are working. This will enable us to still minimise the number of children on site and teachers to manage any Home Learning commitment they have.

Staff and governors have been working hard to make sure that we reduce the risk as much as possible for all our pupils and for our staff so that we can keep everyone as safe as possible. To ensure that risks are minimised, we have undertaken extensive risk assessments, based on government guidelines, including social distancing. We expect everyone – pupils, staff, parents, governors and visitors – to follow these guidelines. If they are not strictly adhered to, we will require individuals, breaking the rules, to self-isolate for two weeks, so that we can be sure they have no symptoms of Covid-19. This is for the safety of everyone. This means that adults (apart from authorised childminders) should not be bringing or collecting children from other families.

We appreciate your co-operation and support during these difficult times.

Please remember, we are here to support you in any way possible; either in school, or continuing to provide home learning.
