End of Term Arrangements

ZOOM Transition Meetings

I am aware that our normal transition arrangements are different and this is causing children some anxiety. Be assured this is completely normal and understandable. In normal circumstances our transition plans are there to support children and for some children we offer additional sessions. Obviously this year will be very different. The children's current teachers will be there to introduce their new class teacher. The current teacher will stay for a short time then leave the meeting to be led by the new teacher.

We are planning to host two Key Stage Leavers assembly via live ZOOM. We will send you invites for these next week. We will follow the normal format where we give children achievement and awards. Please look out for these dates and try to attend.

September Plan

We are still working on plans for September and will update you as soon as possible. However, the key information

for you to know is that all children will be back full time. We have decided to move our INSET days and children will return to school on Thursday 3rd September. Tuesday and Wednesday will be used for training and preparation. I fully appreciate this is late notice and thank you for your support in this. If you have already made prior arrangements please do let us know and we will accommodate these. It is likely that we will keep the system we have been using in the morning and afternoon – that is, a staggered start, with parents leaving the children at the gate, and a staggered collection at the end of the day – with parents using a one-way system and walking through the site, leaving via the Y6 gate. We are working on a 'Recovery Curriculum'. The children will follow their usual English and Maths lessons in the mornings but with a strong emphasis on assessing children's knowledge and understanding and then filling any gaps. We will continue to follow whole school themes, but with a focus on Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE), supported by more use of books and creative arts.

Children will be in bubbles and lunches and breaks will be on a rota. The majority of children will continue to have lunch in their classrooms and there will be no whole school events such as assemblies.

THE 5 LEVERS OF RECOVERY

LEVER 1: RELATIONSHIPS

We will not necessarily expect our children to return joyfully. Many of the relationships that were thriving, such as with friends, teachers, supporting adults may need to be invested in and restored. We will plan for this to happen, not assume that it will.

LEVER 2: COMMUNITY

We will recognise that your child's curriculum will have been based at home for a long time. We will listen to what has happened in this time, understand the needs of our community and engage them in the transitioning of learning back into school.

LEVER 3: TRANSPARENT CURRICULUM

Our children may well feel they have lost time with their learning at school and we want to show them that we understand this and that we will help them to become confident learners at school.

LEVER 4: METACOGNITION

In different environments, children will have been learning in different ways and may have developed different styles of learning. It is vital that we acknowledge this.

LEVER 5: SPACE - TO BE, TO REDISCOVER SELF, AND TO FIND THEIR VOICE ON LEARNING IN THIS ISSUE

It is only natural that we all work at an incredible pace to make sure this group of learners are not disadvantaged against their peers, providing opportunity and exploration alongside the intensity of our expectations.
