Year 6 Building Challenge

Recently, 6 Year 6 children visited Owlsmoor Primary School to participate in a regional 'Build Challenge'. This event focuses on inspiring children into the engineering, architectural, construction and mathematical fields and required our team to manage "finances", collaborate, communicate ideas effectively and overcome problems strategically. The children represented the school fantastically and had a very enjoyable experience.

Year 4 Oxford Castle Trip

On Wednesday the 12th of February, Year 4 took a long coach ride all the way to Oxford to visit the castle and prison. We visited old prison cells and heard stories of the criminals who were imprisoned there. We crept down into the crypt and climbed up the tower, allowing us to see all of Oxford from above! Excitingly, we used historic artifacts and clothes to experience life as a criminal in Oxford prison.



Y5 STEM Project

The school has a very exciting opportunity to work with 3M (a science-based technology company with headquarters in Bracknell), encouraging innovative and original thinkers. Year 5 have been selected to design a slow-mo marble run to present to a staff judging panel for a chance to enter 3M's Young Innovators Challenge, alongside other Bracknell and Wokingham schools. Miss Garnham launched this project with Y5 last week and we are all looking forward to seeing their creative ideas, collaboration skills and reasoning.



Year 5 Chertsey Museum Trip

Year 5 visited Chertsey Museum this term, the children were given the opportunity to make authentic Greek tablets as well as clay Trojan horses throughout the morning session. They then went onto learn about what life was like for both men and women across boarding city states and the expectation set out for children at the time. In the afternoon, children enjoyed performing

Greek myths and exploring the artefacts around the museum. A highlight of the day was going on an ancient Greek hunt where children were challenged to find and identify the twelve Greek Gods and Goddesses!
