Monday 8th March Opening & Arrangements

As you know, following the Government's announcement on Monday, schools are fully opening to all children on 8th March.

What is different now from January is that 'infection rates are significantly down, Frimley not in a state of emergency and numbers in hospital significantly decreasing each day, vaccination programme, most vulnerable had their first injection.

Please read this letter carefully as it contains a lot of information. Saying that, many of the plans will be the same as we had in place during the Autumn term.

COVID 19 is still very prevalent in the community and we need to ensure safety is paramount, therefore please:

- Follow social distance rules
- Adults to wear masks on school site
- If you or anyone in your household or support bubble have any COVID symptoms book a test and the whole household must self isolate until the result is back.

Since January, staff have been using LFD tests to self-test, twice a week from home - this will continue. The government have said primary aged children will not be tested.

Adults will be wearing masks and visors in and around school. Primary children should not wear masks.

Staffing

Lunch

Online ordering for all will return on 8th and the menu is attached. This is the same as the Autumn Term menu. All parents must book and pay for school lunches online and you can now book these. We cannot accept any cash in school. Lunches must be ordered before midnight the day before for all children.

Lunches will be served in classroom for Y2-Y6 and in the Studio for Reception and Y1.

Drop off times

It is still very important that parents/carers keep to the following:-

- Arrive at the designated time for your child's year group
- One adult only to drop off or collect
- Please ensure you and your family are maintaining social distancing whilst waiting
- Adults wear a mask

We will close the whole car park outside school and the community centre whilst drop off and collection takes place. This enables children and families to access the bottom playground safety. Please do not park in the school car park unless you have been given permission.

Please walk if you can, or park in the car park near the scout hut or in South Hill Park.

If you have siblings, please drop off your siblings at the **earlier** time.

Pick up in the afternoon

All parents collecting must queue in the bottom playground and when called, walk round the site using the one-way system to collect their child. There will be adults to direct to the right place. When you pick up your child, stay in the train tracks and your child will come to you. Please keep the line moving. If your Year 5 or 6 child can leave school on their own, please email

<u>secretary@birchhillprimaryschool.co.uk</u> to let us know. Your child will be released at the appropriate time via the back gate. Adults are not allowed to enter the site through the back gate as we have a one-way system operating.

Curriculum & Assessments

We will not run a Recovery Curriculum as we did when the children returned in the Autumn. Teachers will continue to focus on what you have already been doing via remote learning - with a particular emphasis on Key Skills and Concepts in English and Maths. All national statutory assessments have been cancelled. We will be doing our own in-house (PiXL) assessments after the Easter Holidays.

We will be celebrating World Book Day next week, both in school and virtually! There will be a dress up day on Friday 5th March, where the children can come to school, or their online lessons, dressed as a character from their favourite book. Staff are working on a number of other themed days – Red Nose Day (Friday 19th March) and we will send out further details in due course.

Residentials

Access to Remote Learning

If your child is sent home due to COVID we will provide access to Remote Learning. This is likely to be in form of learning packs and weekly live ZOOM sessions with a teacher or TA (not necessarily from their current class.

COVID19 Update.

If your child shows signs;

- ⇒ a new continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- ⇒ a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back 37.8+
- ⇒ a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL (If they are in school, we will send them home).

- Notify the school of their absence.
- ➤ They will have to self-isolate for 10 days.
- Arrange to have a coronavirus test.
- Fellow household members and any support bubble members should self isolate for 10 days, from the day when the first
- > person in the household becomes ill.
- ➤ If any of their household develops symptoms they should request a coronavirus test as soon as possible.
- ➤ Inform the school immediately of the test result via COVIDtest@birchhillprimaryschool.co.uk
