Dear Parent/Carer,

While we are all looking forward to Monday and getting back to a routine, we do appreciate some children (and parents) may have some anxieties. Please try to reassure your child that any worries or anxieties they may have are normal and that we are all here to support them (and you).

A message from the DfE regarding undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing

Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles. Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are <u>different ways</u> for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests. There is a collection point at Bracknell Sports Centre open daily from 1.30pm to 7pm.
- by ordering a home test kit online please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test.

Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.

PE Days

Remember children can come to school in their PE kits on their PE days. Most of the PE sessions will be outdoors, so please ensure your child has a plain tracksuit.

Pick up in the afternoon

All parents collecting must queue in the bottom playground and when called, walk round the site using the one-way system to collect their child. There will be adults to direct to the right place. When you pick up your child, stay in the train tracks and your child will come to you. Please keep the line moving.

If your Year 5 or 6 child can leave school on their own, please email

<u>secretary@birchhillprimaryschool.co.uk</u> to let us know. Your child will be released at the appropriate time via the back gate. Adults are not allowed to enter the site through the back gate as we have a one-way system operating.

Residentials

COVID19 Update.

If your child shows signs;

- ⇒ a new continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- ⇒ a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back 37.8+
- ⇒ a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL (If they are in school, we will send them home).

- Notify the school of their absence.
- They will have to self-isolate for 10 days.
- Arrange to have a coronavirus test.
- Fellow household members and any support bubble members should self isolate for 10 days, from the day when the first
- > person in the household becomes ill.
- ➤ If any of their household develops symptoms they should request a coronavirus test as soon as possible.
- Inform the school immediately of the test result via COVIDtest@birchhillprimaryschool.co.uk
- Parents are advised to follow the latest Public Health England (PHE) guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection at https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance
