Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you have all had a relaxing Easter holiday and were able to enjoy some of the easing of COVID19 restrictions. It has been lovely to see all the children back this week - especially with the warm weather and the chance to open the field.

School life is still similar to before Easter - children are continuing to work in bubbles and having lunch in the classroom. Our main focus is still to settle the children back into school, rebuilding relationships and friendships, and for teachers to continue to assess children and identify gaps in their learning.

COVID restrictions will continue to have an impact on how we operate school - especially not being able to invite parents in for our traditional events such as Sports Days and various performances; however, as always, we will do our utmost to minimise any impact on the children. Maestros will continue to come in and offer peripatetic music lessons, Year 4 and Year 6 will be going on their residential trip to Oakwood in Wokingham. Year 3/4 are beginning to practice for their performance and Year 6 transition arrangements will continue, and we will look at how to do their end of year performance, and the leavers assembly. We are likely to have a Sports Week, where children will compete in a range of races and activities within their bubble.

We will hold a Parents' Evening (virtually) on Tuesday 11th & Thursday 13th May to give an update on how children have settled back into school. As before, we will not provide any summative assessment data or a written report provided. We are holding a range of summative assessments in June and will feed these results into the End of Year written report.
