#### Year 4 - Crime & Punishment

Year 4 have enjoyed a fantastic day out at Oxford Castle and Prison as part of our Crime and Punishment topic. We learnt about the history of the Castle and how it was repurposed as a prison in the Victorian era. We were particularly shocked when we learnt its youngest inmate was younger than us! There was also opportunity to perform a mock trial, where everyone took on a different role in either the defence or prosecution team, for the trial of Mary Blandy - a former inmate of the prison. The children were polite, showed resilience whilst climbing the 101 steps of St George's tower and represented the school in a fantastic manner. Well done!



#### Year 5 - Ufton Court Trip

Recently, Year 5 had a brilliant day at Ufton Court learning about the Ancient Greeks. We started the day by learning about the City States of Ancient Greece by looking at artefacts and then became Greek hoplites with swords and spears. In the afternoon, children took the roles of judges, jury witnesses and criminals to discover Ancient Greek crime and punishment... some children experienced time in the stocks!
