



Make Your Mark

Year 5 and 6 have taken part in Make your Mark this year. Make Your Mark is the largest consultation of 11 - 18 year olds in Europe. It gives Young People the chance to have their say on what matters to them and to bring about social change through meaningful representation and campaigning Make Your Mark is facilitated by the UK Youth Parliament. UK Youth Parliament meet together nationally twice a year, at their Annual Conference, and the House of Commons Sitting. The three topics with the most votes (decided through Make Your

Mark) become the campaigns that Members of Youth Parliament work on throughout their two year term.

In 2020 over 185,000 votes determined which 3 issues became Campaigns: Stop Plastic Pollution; Mental Health and Transforming Education. In 2019, Bracknell had the 3rd greatest turnout in the UK!
