#### **Class Split and Transitions**

Due to Covid, we have not mixed our classes up for a few years. Please speak to your child over the weekend and ask them who they would like as a buddy/friend in their new class. Teachers will also ask the children next week and begin the transition programme with the children over the next few weeks.

The rationale for mixing the classes is to broaden the children's friendship groups and purposely give the children these transition experiences to build up their resilience, which will help them as they get older.

Class teachers work closely together to make sure each class has a balanced mix of boys and girls as well as abilities groups and special educational needs, we will ensure where possible, all children have at least one friend in their new class.

We fully appreciate this can cause anxiety for some children and we are mindful of this. We will work with children now, and also in September to make this transition as smooth as possible.

#### Year 6 Charity

Year 6 have been overwhelmed this week by the incredible generosity of donations for their charity, Gibson's Go Getters. We cannot thank you all enough for your efforts with the sponsored walking over half term. The children should be very proud of themselves. 




Nursery
