Personal, Social & Emotional Development:

Talk about their feelings using words like happy, sad, angry or worried Understand gradually how others might be feeling Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community

Communication & Language:

Sing a large repertoire of songs Use longer sentences of 4 – 6 words Use a wider range of vocabulary

Physical Development:

Use one-handed tools and equipment Increasingly be able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movement which are related to music and rhythm

Continue to develop their movement,

balancing, riding and ball skills

Literacy:

Understand the key concepts about print: the names of the different parts of a book Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can: recognise words with the same initial sound Begin to engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary

Mathematics:

Develop fast recognition of up to 3 objects, without having to count them (subitising)
Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total Show 'finger numbers' up to 5 Link numerals to amounts

Understanding the World:

Talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people

Expressive Arts and Design:

Remember and sing entire songs Sing the melodic shape of familiar songs

Topic:	Festivals and Celebrations
What I will learn about:	I will learn simple facts about different festivals and celebrations that happen around this time of
	year. I will learn about Diwali, Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day, St Andrew's Day and Christmas. I
	will learn who celebrates these festivals and why and what they do during the festival. As part of the
	topic I will be looking at colour and finding colours all around me. I will also produce lots of art work
	and will be leaning different techniques to make pictures.
	I will also learn about Jigsaw Jenie and Jerrie Cat who will help me to understand my feelings and
	how to kind in class.
	I will learn all about the number 2. I will begin to learn to subitise and what equals means. I will also
	be introduced to a 5 frame.
	I will play simple games to help me identify words that have the same initial sound.
Vocabulary I will learn:	Diwali: the Hindu festival of lights
	Bonfire Night: celebrating the failed plot of Guy Fawkes to blow up the Houses of Parliament
	Fireworks: things that explode to make light
	Remembrance: remembering the soldiers who have fought in the wars
	St Andrew: the patron saint of Scotland
	Christmas: the Christian celebration of Jesus' birth
	Colour: red, yellow, blue, green etc
	Subitise: to be able to know how many objects are there without counting them
	Equals: the same, equivalent
	5 Frame: a way of counting up to 5 objects
	Initial sound: the sound at the beginning of a word
Possible activities I can do at home:	Talk about the different festivals.
	Look for colours.
	Use colours for drawing and painting pictures.
	Find things to count.
	Play I spy.
What I will achieve :	I will be able to recall simple facts about the different festivals and explain a little about what
	happens during each of them. I will be able to talk confidently about the colour of different objects.
	I will take part in Jigsaw group times and learn about feelings and how to be a kind member of my
	class.
	I will confidently count up to 2 objects and recognise number 2. I will know what a 5 frame is and
	how to use it. I will begin to be able to explain what equals means.
