Personal, Social & Emotional Development:

Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community

Play with one or more children, extending and elaborating play ideas

Communication & Language:

Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns

Use talk to organise themselves and their play

Physical Development:

Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding and ball skills

Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils

Literacy:

Develop their phonological awareness

Engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary

Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing

Numeracy:

Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes

Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity

Understanding the World:

Begin to make sense of their own life-story and family history

Expressive Arts:

Remember and sing entire songs

Vocabulary I will learn:	Season: one of the four parts of the year, summer: the season between spring and autumn
	Shape language: round, tall, long, short, fat, thin, pointy, smooth, square, curved, flat, big, small, sides, corners
	Colours: light, dark, primary colour: red, yellow, blue, secondary colour: orange, purple, green, mix
	Similar: being almost the same as something else
	Different: not the same
Possible activities I can do at home:	Go on a summer walk.
	Experiment with colour changing.
	Have lots of conversations.
	Sing lots of songs, nursery rhymes and appropriate pop songs.
	Go on a shape hunt and talk about the things you see/find.
