#### Harvest Festival

At this time of year, around the world, harvest is being celebrated and people are giving thanks for the food we eat. In school, we will be sharing a whole school assembly and will reflect on what we are thankful for. As part of this, we would like to support the work of the Bracknell foodbank, who have been supporting the



most in need within our community. As you can see from this information, they have been extremely busy!

- So far this year we have provided a 3 day emergency food supply for 4167 people, 1683 of these were children.
- Demand is currently double what it was this time last year thanks to the increased cost-ofliving
- People come for lots of different reasons: sickness, change in benefits, unemployment, debt, but for 40% of people the main reason given is 'low income'.
- We work with 120ish referral agencies in Bracknell (council groups, schools, churches etc) who send people to us
- All our food is donated by the local community except the fresh food which is funded by the council.
- So far this year 48 tonnes of food has been donated to foodbank. That's the weight of 48 cars!

They have let us know that they are most in need of **toilet roll, size 3-7 nappies and toiletries**. If you are able, and would like to support the school in helping them meet the needs of others, please send in your contributions either via your child's class, or through the school office from Monday 10th October until Friday 14th October. We will arrange delivery of the items to the foodbank on behalf of the school. Thank you.



### **Year 4 News**

Year 4 have been learning about the digestive system as part of our topic 'Where does my food go?'. As part of a practical lesson, the children used every day materials including a cardboard tube, a paper cup, a leg from a pair of tights and a weetabix to replicate how the digestive system works. They enjoyed getting a bit messy and finding out about the different parts of the digestive system.



#### Year 3 News

This week Year 3 have enjoyed a session in the edible garden. The children were split into 5 groups and experienced 5 different activities including: weeding, planting, watering and labelling new crops. The children thoroughly enjoyed the session and learnt how much fun it can be getting their hands dirty in the garden. We are all very excited to see how well our radishes grow and will hopefully, get to taste them once they are harvested.





## **Family Workshop**

Thank you to all of those who came to the Year 1 Maths Family Learning Workshop this week. It was clear that the children enjoyed working with their adult in school and parents and carers commented that they enjoyed the experience too.
