Academy Update

In line with the national agenda, Governors and the Senior Leadership Team have been researching academy partners for the last 6 months. We started the process by identifying seven potential Multi Academy Trusts (MATs) that are working in the local and surrounding area. This was reduced to four in early January and on Monday night, Governors and the Senior Leadership Team interviewed the final two. We are pleased to let you know that we have now selected Maiden Erlegh Trust as our preferred partner. Over the coming months we will work with the DfE, LA, Maiden Erlegh Trust, school staff and parents through a formal consultation process to ensure that they are the best fit for everyone at Birch Hill. This is just for your information at this stage, but we will keep you updated on any progress and will let you know dates and times for any upcoming meetings with the Trust should you wish to attend. If, at the end of the consultation process, all parties agree and subject to DfE approval, we will formally join Maiden Erlegh Trust between September and December 2023.
