

Why is The Amazon vital to our survival?

Due: Monday 22nd May

We have loved seeing your creative projects, so this time we would like you to research and create a project on the Amazon Rainforest.

The Amazon is vast so there is a wealth of information available to you. Below are a few ideas of how you could present your projects. You have four weeks for this home learning project; therefore, we would like to see you produce 2 individual mini-projects (for example a Survival guide and a Documentary). This list is not final – we are sure you can be even more creative!

Survival Guide Make a rainforest survival guide including a kit list, dangerous animals, health and safety instructions and diagrams for camp building.	Animal Creation Combine the features of two animals from the rainforest to create your own new animal. What would you name it? Why did you choose those features?	Documentary Create a short film, maybe in the style of David Attenborough, to explain what you have researched about the Amazon Rainforest.	Brazil The Amazon is partially situated in Brazil, which is rich in culture. What is the Rio Carnival? Can you try cooking a traditional Brazilian dish and get your family to review it?
Tribes Who lives in the Amazon? How do they live? How is their lifestyle different to your own?	Literature Write a poem, or a story, about the Amazon rainforest. It could focus on the animal, the nature, the life of a trekker – or anything else you can think of!	Dance Choreograph your own rainforest-inspired dance. What music/sounds would be most appropriate? Either video your efforts or be prepared to perform it in school.	Deforestation Create a poster or leaflet informing people about what products we could lose if we do not protect the rainforest. What impact will this have? What can we do to help?

To help you develop a range of skills, we would like to see you try something new and not repeat the same style of projects you have previously done (for example, if you have already done a PowerPoint presentation try to think of another way you can display your findings).
