### Maths

Addition and Subtraction – children will learn a range of skills involving addition, such as using a number line and a number square. The will learn how to subtract by counting back in hops and subtraction on a number line.

Measurement: Money Children explore money by
applying mathematical
knowledge to pounds and pence.

Multiplication and Division - Children are exposed to multiplication and division through arrays.

Children will learn and perform the Christmas Nativity Story.

### PSHE: Celebrating Difference

Children will learn how to accept that everyone is different, include others when working and playing, help if someone is being bullied, solve problems, use kind words and give and receive compliments.

### PSHE - Celebrating Differences

Children will look at being the same and being different, explore what is meant by the term 'bullying', understand what to do about bullying, learn how to make new friends, celebrate differences whilst celebrate being ME!

### History

Children explore the life of Florence Nightingale, who has contributed to national and international achievements. They will compare aspects of life in these different periods.

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### Music

Children will use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and rhymes from the nativity.

### Geography

Children will learn about the seven continents and five oceans. They will identify the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom. In addition, children will locate the countries involved in the Crimean war (Britain, France, Turkey and Russia) using a map, atlases and globes.

English: Diary writing

Children will have the opportunity to write a diary entry from both the perspectives of Florence and a soldier. Here, children will explore writing using the four different sentences types whilst mastering the skill of consistently using full stops, capital letters, commas for lists and expanded noun phrases within their writing.

## Physical Education: Social Cog

Children will learn how to show and tell others about their ideas, how to be patient and support peers, how to help, praise and encourage friends and how to work sensibly with others by taking turns and sharing.
