During the summer break Taksh in Year 5 participated in 'Sprint with the Stars' at the London Aquatics Centre Olympic swimming pool. He competed in a field of over 600 athletes from across the UK for a chance to race with Olympic champions and world record holders like Adam Peaty and David Popovici.

Taksh successfully qualified for the finals in all four events and got a chance to meet his idols up close, chat with them and also take photographs with all of them! Despite being super tired he was buzzing at the end of the day.

Apart from this, following his recent Swimathon 2023 Taksh has taken up another charitable initiative - swim 26 miles (42 km) over a 12-week period starting 1st Aug to raise money for Wateraid.

He has almost completed the challenge in less than 6 weeks and will continue to swim for the cause until 24th Oct. He has set a target contribution of £100 and is almost there through support from family and friends.
