


GUIDELINES: For their Show and Tell, we would like children to talk about castles or a fairy tale. Below are some ideas for activities you can do with your child. If your child has any other ideas for an activity they would like to show to their class, that is absolutely fine.

<p><b>Castles and Fairy Tales</b></p>	<p><b><u>Computing</u></b> Using a computer program of your choice, draw a castle or a picture of your favourite fairy tale character.</p>	<p><b><u>English</u></b> Write sentences to describe a fairy tale character.</p>	<p><b><u>Art</u></b> Can you experiment with different colours to draw or paint a castle?</p>	<p><b><u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u></b> Draw a picture of and talk about a parent/carer or family friend who is important to you.</p>
<p><b>Show and Tell</b></p>				
	<p><b><u>Music</u></b> Make a musical instrument out of recycled materials and dried pasta, rice or pulses. Perform a favourite nursery rhyme to the class.</p>	<p><b><u>Reading</u></b> Bring in your favourite book and share it with the class.</p>	<p><b><u>Maths</u></b> Build a castle wall using an array of Lego blocks. Ask a parent or carer to take a photo to bring or email in.</p>	<p><b>PE</b> Practise catching a ball. See how many times you can clap your hands between the ball going up into the air and you catching it. Ask a parent or carer to take a photo to bring or email in.</p>
